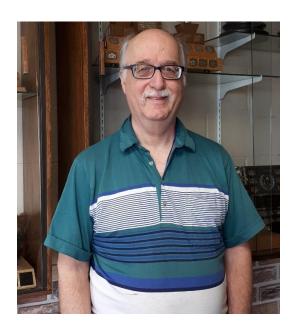
# Welcome our two new staff

## Club receives \$144,700 grant to improve accessibility

On Saturday, March 25, MPP David Piccini visited the Norwood Curling Club to announce \$200,900 of funding for upgrades at our club and the Norwood club.

The grants from the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF), will replace the roof of the Norwood club and improve accessibility at our club.

The Norwood club received a \$86,200 grant to replace the roof on its century-old facility. Our club received a \$114,700 grant that will allow us to improve accessibility by widening doors, adding ramps, and installing a wheelchair lift to allow access to the ice surface.
